
Reading Group

A Walk in the Woods: Rediscovering America on the Appalachian Trail is a funny book, full of dry humor in the native-American grain. It is also a serious book.

Nothing really terrible happened to the author, but by playing on our fears, he captures the ambivalence of our feelings about the wild. We revere it but we're also intimidated. He was often exhausted, his "brain like a balloon tethered with string, accompanying but not actually part of the body below." The reader, by contrast, is rarely anything but exhilarated. And you don't have to take a step.


Program Updates

Training Day Success

The Indian Peaks Wilderness Alliance kicked off the summer patrol season with our annual training day on the first Saturday in June. The training committee welcomed 34 new volunteers along with **54 returning volunteers** for a great day of learning and fellowship. The Boulder Ranger District team joined to provide valuable information to our new volunteers and to field questions from returning volunteers around year over year procedural changes.

Nearly 20 returning volunteers stepped up to deliver content throughout the day. Morning sessions focused on proper patrol scheduling,




Winter Patrol Season Wrap-Up

Thanks to our dedicated volunteers, the 2024–25 winter season was a huge success. Here's what we accomplished together:

- 131 patrol hikes completed across the region
 - 80 from Brainard Lake Recreation Area (BRLA)
 - 25 from IPW South trailheads (Hessie, Rainbow Lakes, South Sourdough)
 - 8 from IPW North trailheads (Beaver Reservoir, Camp Dick, St. Vrain Mt.)
 - 18 from James Peak Wilderness (East Portal TH)
- 762 total miles patrolled
- 531 volunteer hours logged
- 4 minor medical assists
- 2,756 visitors and 383 dogs spotted on trails
- 389 meaningful visitor interactions
- 4 illegal fire rings removed
- Common violations observed:
 - E-bikes in Wilderness areas
 - Dogs off-leash
- 10 outreach events including REI Boulder & Denver, Dairy Center for the Arts, and interagency efforts at BRLA
- \square Top patrollers this winter:
 - Conrad L. 19 patrols
 - Bryon L. 11
 - Andy G. & Lincoln G. 10 each
 - Cynthia G. 9

Summer Patrol Hits the Ground Running!

Our Summer Patrollers have hit the ground running! We've had **over 35 patrols** with excellent distribution throughout JPW/IPW, and the impact of our work is already apparent. Our early season trail and campsite condition reporting has been better than ever, we've already **cleared 14 fire rings**, our **reporting on violations is leading to remediation**, we **started a new bridge survey program**, and we've **helped numerous folks out on the trail**.

The patrol reports are directly incorporated into the Summer Patrol Coordinator Team's weekly summary for our Forest Service partners, helping inform priorities and action. What we're doing really matters - **thank you!**

Mentorship Milestones: New Volunteers Hitting the Trail **34 new volunteers** joined us for training on June 7th and have now entered the final phase of their onboarding: the mentorship program.

- On June 21st, 19 volunteers
 participated in a Group Mentor
 Patrol out of Brainard, providing
 patrol coverage across much of
 the surrounding Wilderness while
 applying their new skills in the
 field.
- Looking ahead, 24 volunteers are registered for the next Group Mentor Patrol on June 28th out of Hessie.

We're excited to report that 5 volunteers have already completed their mentorship and are now approved to patrol independently. A big congratulations to Todd Day and his mentor, Conrad Lattes, for being the first to complete the program!







Sharpening Skills: Sawyer Team Grows!

Five volunteers took part in our recent sawyer training, including three returning pros recertifying and two brand-new sawyers joining the ranks.
