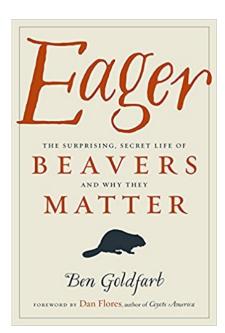
#### **Reading Group**

In Eager, environmental journalist Ben Goldfarb reveals that our modern idea of what a healthy landscape looks like and how it was affected by the fur trade that removed millions of beavers from North America's lakes and rivers. The consequences of losing beavers were profound: streams eroded, wetlands dried up, and species lost vital habitat. Eager is a powerful story about one of the most influential species, how North America was colonized, how our landscapes have changed over the centuries, and how beavers can help us fight drought, flooding, wildfire, extinction, and the ravages of climate change. Ultimately, it's about how we can learn to coexist, harmoniously and even beneficially, with our fellow travelers on this planet.

### **Summer Patrol Update**

IPWA's summer patrollers have been working exceptionally hard this season.

We've cleared an astonishing 120 fire rings (check out our <u>social media post</u>), completed over 340 patrols covering about 2,470 miles, and worked hard to educate the public about stewardship,

best LNT principles, legal camping locations, and more! Our exciting new initiatives to help out our Forest Service partners are also going strong: we've completed nearly 30 bridge surveys and we just began a new program to help with trail counter maintenance and data collection.
