- Photos must be in a .jpeg format.
- The photograph must include the following information with each photograph submitted:
 - Photographer's name
 - Location of the photo
 - Date taken
 - Why the photo showcases the Wilderness characteristics of the IP/JP Wilderness areas.

We have done several hikes and many of the students do not have adequate hiking clothes and equipment. IPWA volunteer and UNC instructor Jessica Feld will be collecting any used hiking and outdoor gear to share with them.

- Build a rock water bar to help redirect water from a seep on a wet section of trail.
- Scree the trail around the water bar to help focus hiker traffic and improve water flow from the seep.
