We are so appreciative of all the hard work and positive energy everyone put into making this one of the best seasons we've ever had. To try to summarize how special this season was, this year IPWA:

- Welcomed our largest-ever class of new volunteers, which was made possible by those of you who stepped up to be mentors.
- Completed 36% more service activities (including 66% more trailhead host shifts!), and cleared 49% more fire rings, compared with last year.
- Piloted very cool data collection initiatives that will help the Forest Service track key use trends and maintenance needs over time.
