

As the snow begins to melt, our winter patrol reports are integral in preparing for the summer season. We use them to determine summer trail projects needed and direct our resources to keep the trails open and accessible to the growing number of wilderness

visitors. Make sure to check our trail reports for the latest conditions on your favorite trails!

Winter Patrol Tip: Fluctuating temperatures and seasonal high winds make for constantly changing terrain. Make sure to pack extra gear (i.e. skis/snowshoes AND micro spikes) when planning your next adventure.
