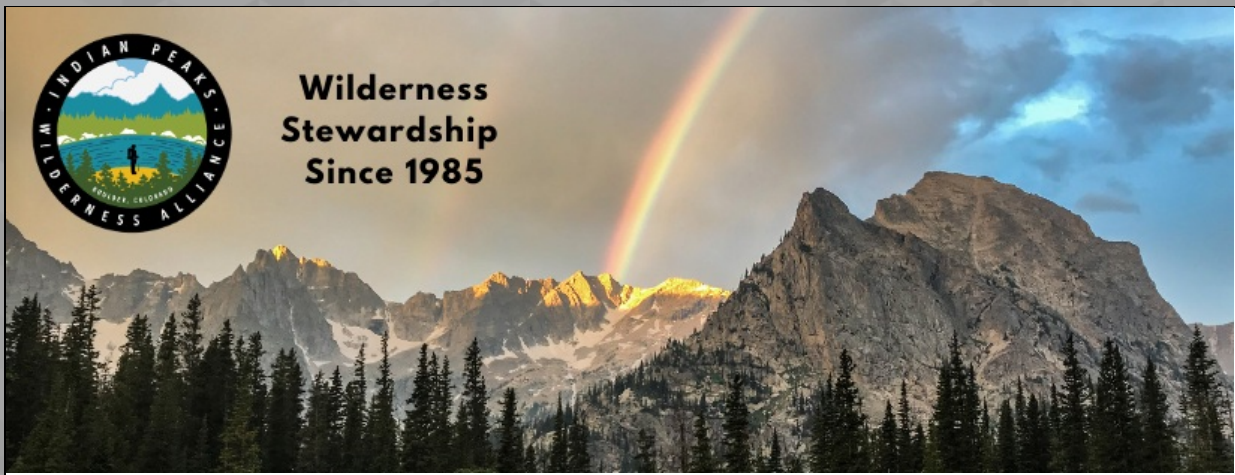

If you are wondering how to help those impacted by the Marshall Fire, here is a list of resources that we gathered from Denver Channel 7 News and Colorado Public Radio.

- Donate to the [Boulder County Wildfire Fund](#). The Community Foundation Boulder County, in partnership with Government and nonprofit organizations, will work to support the needs of the community as they emerge.
- Donate to Neptune Mountaineering's [Coat & Shoe Drive](#) (they are especially in need of kid's items).
- Donate items to the [Sister Carmen Community Center](#). They are currently requesting gift cards (\$100 increments to Walmart, Target, Costco, local area restaurants), food (easy-to-eat and no-prep food such as granola bars, snack mixes, apples, oranges, peanut butter, bread, crackers, packaged frozen foods, soups, etc.) and sleeping bags. Items can be dropped off at 655 Aspen Ridge Drive, Lafayette at the East entrance.
- If you have shelter to offer displaced residents, please sign up to be a vetted host at Airbnb.com and you will be alerted through the [Airbnb Open Homes Program](#) if needed.
